Seeking deeper communion with God through experiencing the Holy Land, Biblical teaching, worship, prayer and community.

The Terrace Lake Holy Land trip is designed to enable us to experience the place where so much of Scripture occurred and more specifically where Christ ministered and our faith began. While we do not see a visit to Israel as a required pilgrimage for Christians, since we are called to take the gospel to every corner of the earth, we do see great advantage to experiencing the places our Savior walked, providing context to the truth we read in Scripture. On this trip we will be forced to break out of our western view of scripture and we will seek to learn more about our Creator God through experience, worship and community. The goal is not to simply walk where Jesus walked, but through this journey to learn more how we are called to walk as He walked.

TOUR COST

Tour cost: \$2,862 (Cash discount \$2,807)

Total estimated cost, including flight, around \$4,000-\$4,500.



Tour cost includes:

- All ground travel, beginning and ending at airport (assuming you arrive and leave at set times given in the itinerary)
- Ground travel will be on a modern bus with A/C and Wi-Fi
- Professional, licensed Christian guide
- Entrance fees to all sites, according to itinerary
- All hotel accommodations (4 stars or better), according to itinerary
- Hotel costs are for double rooms. If you want a single room, there will be an added cost of \$980.
- Breakfast and dinner included for all tour dates (does not include travel to/from Israel)
- 2 small bottles of water per person per day
- Tips to be paid to guide, driver, bellhops, maitre'd's, and hotelier's
- Travel Insurance
- 1 copy of Devotional Treasures in the Holy Land

Tour cost does NOT include:

- Airline tickets
- Everything not mentioned above
- Any alcohol
- Lunches
- Personal expenses (for example: souvenirs, extra drinks, any travel not organized by the group)
- Extra meals

*When paying online via card there is a 2.5% processing fee charged. To help cover those fees to the church, we have added 2% to the overall trip cost. **If paing by cash, use discount code: CASH -- If paying for a child use discount code: KIDSCASH** (More information for kids price see FAQs).

**If you want a single room, there is an added cost of \$980 that will be split up amongst the three payments.

FLIGHTS

Each traveler is responsible for purchasing their own airline ticket. Everyone must arrive in Tel Aviv by 5pm on Tuesday, November 3.

Below is a general flight itinerary. We recommend that you join the staff leaders for a “flight booking party” if you would like to travel on the same itinerary together. (More information coming.)

Outbound: Depart Indianapolis (or other nearby international airport) the morning of Monday, November 2, arrive in Tel Aviv the morning/afternoon (local time) of Tuesday, November 3. (15-18 hours of flight travel, depending of the flight chosen).

Return: Depart Tel Aviv in the morning/afternoon of Thursday, November 12 and arrive in Indy late that night (15-18 hours of flight travel).

HOTEL

*Jericho and Jerusalem hotels have not been selected. We will be staying at 5-star hotels similar to the Oasis and Lady Stern pictured below.



FAQ'S

How do I register for the tour?

Starting Sunday, February 22 the registration will be open. To access the registration, go to the Holy Land page of the website (terracelake.org/israel) or use the QR code here. The registration application includes general traveler information, a couple of important questions, and paying the deposit (which you will have the option to do online or pay later). If you are paying by cash, please use the discount code: CASH and pay the appropriate amount.

Once you complete the registration application AND we receive your deposit, you will be registered, IF you are one of the first 20 people to do so. If there are 20 people signed up, you can still register and pay to have your spot on the waiting list reserved. If a registered traveler needs to cancel for some reason, we will approach the first travelers on the waiting list to take their spot.

Who will be teaching/leading the trip?

This tour will be lead by a professional tour guide, who will be in charge of managing our itinerary, teaching us about the history and culture of the sites, and our main contact with all local authorities. There will also be 4 Terrace Lake staff/leaders on the trip with the following responsibilities:

- Pastor Carey Edgren will be providing biblical teaching and spiritual leadership throughout the trip.
- Pastor Isaac Manuel will be leading us in worship and praise throughout the trip and at specific sites.
- Jessica Manuel will be documenting the trip through photos and video for future use within TLC.
- Leah Sandlin is our administrative and logistical contact and support.

We will be partnering with Riviera Tours, in Israel. They will be coordinating all hotel accommodations, reservations at certain sites, bus transportation and driver, the Whisper audio technology, and any on the ground needs that arise. The name of our tour guide is Faris Azar. We met him in 2022 when we took our "scouting" trip and we knew we found a great guide. We know you are going to love him too. Faris is a Palestinian Christian living in Jerusalem and is a registered guide with Israel's board of tourism.

Is it safe to travel in Israel?

Safety is a very important question, and it's one we take seriously. While Israel is located in a region that can experience tension, tourists travel safely there each year, especially when working with experienced tour operators, licensed local guides, and carefully planned itineraries that avoid areas of concern. We monitor official travel advisories and remain in communication with our in-country partners to ensure a tour is advisable and safe. If at any point we need to cancel the trip due to safety, or you need to withdraw for the same, a refund will be made.

What if the trip needs to be cancelled?

Travel to Israel is dependent on many factors, as with any international travel there are always risks and potentials reasons for a trip needing to be postponed or cancelled. If that becomes a reality for this trip, there will be multiple options for you: 1) receive a full refund, 2) transfer your deposit(s) towards a future trip (funds will be held for that purpose), or 3) donate your deposit(s) toward a scholarship fund to be used for a future traveler. Terrace Lake currently intends to take trips to the Holy Land every other year, so if this trip needs to be cancelled we will determine if we can reschedule within the year, or if we will wait till the next planned trip.

How large is the group we are traveling with?

Our plan is to have 20 travelers and 4 leaders on this trip. There will be no other groups sharing the bus and tour guide with us.

Can I bring my kids?

The better question may be "Should I bring my kids?"

If it is your first (and potentially only) time traveling to Israel, we highly recommend you travel without children so that you can get the most out of the experience. If you plan to take children, it is our recommendation that all travelers be at least 12 years of age or older to be able to both benefit from the tour and not take away from other tour member's experience. Our days are full and most adult travelers are ready for bed after dinner. If you do plan to bring your children the cost is 50% for kids 0-8, as long as they share a room with their parents.

What is the refund/cancellation policy?

The amount of refund you receive depends on when you cancel. That information will be available upon request.

What currency is accepted in Israel?

Credit/debit cards and US dollars are widely accepted in Israel. If you plan to use your credit/debit card, make sure you contact your credit card company and/or bank and let them know about your travel. AND we recommend you make sure the cards you plan to take have "tap-to-pay," as that is definitely the most convenient way to pay.

We do recommend that you have some cash on hand: \$150-200 per person and 200-300 shekels. You can exchange money at the airport or hotels if you would like. You should be aware that you may receive change in shekels if you pay with dollars, so be prepared to convert in your head to ensure you get correct change. We will discuss the current exchange rate closer to the trip.

What if I don't like crowds and/or crowded spaces?

You need to be aware that there will be crowds nearly everywhere we go. Some of the sites we go to will be very cramped, so if that is a concern for you, you may want to opt out of visiting them. We will discuss site specifics as the trip gets closer.

How active of a trip is this? What should I expect in terms of fitness required?

The set itinerary is a fairly active tour. We will walk or hike between 1-5 miles a day. Some of the hikes offered are more difficult. If you feel like you are unable to participate in a site or a hike, you are always able to stay on the bus or in the gift shop area (if there is one).

As the trip gets closer, we will talk more about "training" to make sure we are all ready for the trip and no one is getting left behind or holding the group up.

What if I want to do some travel on my own before or after the scheduled tour?

You are certainly able to add on any travel you would like outside of the scheduled tour. The only requirement is that you do all you can to arrive in Tel Aviv by 5pm on Tuesday, November 3 and stay with the group through Thursday, November 12.

If I am traveling as a single, what is the roommate situation?

You do not have to have a roommate. If you wish to have your own room, there is a one-time \$980 supplement you will need to pay. If you would like to be paired with a roommate you can either determine who that is and let us know, or we will try to pair you with one.

What are the visa and passport requirements?

There is no visa required ahead of time. Israel requires that your passport be valid for at least 6 months from the date of our return. Please check your passport now so you can begin the renewal process as soon as possible, if needed.

Do I need to purchase travel insurance?

We have included the cost of travel insurance in your overall trip cost. Travel insurance will cover things like: lost luggage, flight delays/cancellations, medical expenses (most health insurance does not cover international travel), etc.

Do I need to have certain vaccines/immunizations to travel to Israel?

No. There are no required vaccines/immunizations for traveling to Israel. It is recommended that you are up to date on routine vaccinations.

Will my cell phone work?

If you have a cell phone with international capabilities, contact your company for costs and to verify that it will work in Israel. We will have at least 2 staff members with working cell phones if there is an emergency, but if you will be using the phone regularly, we recommend getting international coverage for the length of the tour.

How will my family contact me if I don't have a cell phone?

We will have an emergency contact sheet for you to share with family. It will include staff numbers available to call, and the itinerary of hotels and numbers.

How much luggage can I take?

As far as our tour company goes: Each traveler is permitted 1 suitcase and 1 carry on (plus your purse, camera case, etc.). The size of these bags will be determined by airline guidelines.

What will the weather be like?

Mild. Israel in November offers near perfect weather, transitioning from summer heat to cooler evenings with warm sunny days. We will share more details on weather as the trip gets closer.

What should I wear?

You should plan to dress comfortably, respectfully, and ready for walking. This will mean something different for each person. The main cultures in Israel (Jewish and Muslim) dress conservatively, especially for women. We want to be aware of and respectful of this. Most sites we visit do not have dress codes, but some will ask that legs be covered, so be prepared for that (we will share with you which sites those are so you can plan accordingly).

Do I need to plan to tip?

No. Tips are included in your tour cost and will be distributed by a leader to the appropriate people at the right times. You are certainly allowed to tip for personal or exceptional experiences at your own discretion. We will also give you the opportunity to add to the tip for our guide and driver if you feel they have provided the service to merit it.

How will our team communicate on the ground?

We will use "WhatsApp" to communicate as a team and while we are in Israel. The leadership will use this to communicate important details to the group. We will ask that you have that app downloaded for the trip.

What type of food will we eat? What if I have dietary restrictions?

The food is Mediterranean and Palestinian. There will be lots of fresh fruit and veggies, meat (mostly chicken and fish) will be offered at every meal, and fresh bread. Breakfast and dinner will be buffet style at our hotel every day. So, if you do have dietary restrictions, you should be able to find food that meets your needs. Lunches will be at sites, or different restaurants while we are out touring. You should plan for \$10-15 per day per person for lunch. If dietary restrictions are a concern for lunch, please plan to bring pre-packaged food that you know you can eat for lunches.

Will I need an adapter/converter for my electronics?

An adapter (which changes the shape of the plug) and/or a converter (to change the electric current) are necessary if you plan to use an electric appliance in a foreign country. Israel uses 220 volts AC (instead of the 120 used in the United States), single phase, 50 Hertz. Most of the hotels have hair dryers and 110/220 electric shaver sockets (will take shavers from either voltage). Some chargers for cell phones, computers, iPads, and cameras only require a small adapter, while other small appliances such as flat irons, hair dryers, etc. may require a converter as well as an adapter (you may want to verify this on your individual devices). Universal adapters and converters can be purchased at most retail stores selling electronics.
